Goal of the Project & Target Populations

The goal of the initiative is to support stroke providers and community organizations in implementing stroke community awareness activities to the priority population(s) within the communities they serve.

Priority populations include people who are:

- Black non-Hispanic,
- Asian non-Hispanic,
- Hispanic populations, and/or
- With the highest risk for stroke and/or communities where traditional public awareness activities may not reach.



Who Can Apply?

Interested organizations should seek out collaborative partners to conduct public awareness activities together.

Collaborations must include at least 1 healthcare partner.

Minimum eligible partnership includes 2 organizations from 2 different domains.

More than 2 organizations is fine.



Lead Organizations

- EMS*
- Hospitals*
- Post-acute* including rehabilitation hospitals, home care agencies, and skilled nursing facilities
- Community Health Centers/Primary Care*

Responsibilities of lead organizations include:

- 1. Pre-award: Submitting application materials (application + letters of participation)
- 2. Post-award: May act as fiscal agents, depending on project need
- 3. Post-award: Participating in activities and collecting signed photo releases
- 4. Post-award: Participating in check-in calls with Borderland Partners
- 5. Post-award: Submitting final report and other docs (eg, photos)



Partner Organizations

- Local health departments
- Community organizations providing resources to at risk populations, e.g. social services and/or chronic disease prevention services
- Faith-based organizations

Responsibilities of partner organizations include:

- 1. Pre-award: Submitting application materials (letters of participation)
- 2. Post-award: May act as fiscal agents, depending on project need
- 3. Post-award: Participating in activities and collecting signed photo releases
- 4. Post-award: Participating in check-in calls with Borderland Partners
- 5. Post-award: Contributing to final report and providing other documents (eg, photos)



Eligibility

Projects must include collaboration involving organizations from two or more domains to carry out stroke awareness activities to educate the public on the following:

- Signs and symptoms of stroke.
- What to do if you suspect you, or someone else, is having a stroke.
- Risk factors for stroke.
- Ways to decrease risk of stroke.



If you see <u>any</u> sign of a stroke, don't hesitate—call 911!

Care starts when the ambulance arrives.





Eligible & Ineligible Activities

Examples of Eligible Activities



- Hosting a stroke education table or activity at a local food pantry, farmers market,
 or other community event.
- Partnering with area Council on Aging to distribute F.A.S.T. materials with the medically-tailored home meal delivery service.
- Developing a stroke awareness message to be delivered at a sporting/theater/music event.
- Hosting a series of stroke education sessions in-person or virtually during Stroke
 Month (May).
- Hosting a large/small community education event.
- Salaries for staff who are working directly at an event.



Examples of Ineligible Activities



- Indirect (overhead) costs for lead organizations and their partners.
- Funding used to educate applicants'/partners' staff or providers.
- Creating collateral materials that duplicate what is already available in the Massachusetts Clearinghouse.
- Equipment or technology that is not directly related to educating the community and/or patients at risk for or recovering from stroke.



Budget

\$20,000 MAX

Award

- ✓ Number and size of awards will depend on the number of organizations that apply and meet funding criteria.
- ✓ Budget is broken down into "Lead organization" and "Partner organization(s)."
- ✓ Applicants are asked to specify Staff, Supplies, Equipment, and Other expenses, and to justify the amounts requested.
- ✓ Estimated expenses are ok.
- ✓ All funded activities must be completed by June 28, 2024.



Application Process

- 1. Lead organizations complete the application (available at https://borderland-partners.com/strokeawareness).
- 2. Lead organizations submit the required documents via email to stroke@borderland-partners.com
- 3. Required documents consist of:
 - Completed application form (Word Document or PDF)
 - Completed budget (found on the final page of the application)
 - Letter of Participation for each collaborative partner/site (Word Document or PDF)
- 4. The application materials are due no later than 5 pm on April 5, 2024.
 - No late submissions will be accepted.
- 5. Selections will be announced Friday, April 12, 2024.
